Invocation Confession and Forgiveness

Blessed be the holy Trinity, \pm one God, who gathers us in the wilderness to redeem us, anoint us, and make us new. **Amen.**

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Ash Wednesday Litany- Psalm 51

- ¹ Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.
- ² Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.
- ³ For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.
- ⁴ Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are proved right when you speak and justified when you judge.
- ⁵ Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.
- ⁶ Surely you desire truth in the inner parts; you teach me wisdom in the inmost place.

Sermon

Distribution of The Ashes

During our worship service this Ash Wednesday, we have the opportunity to come forward and receive the Ashes of Penance placed upon our foreheads. In this act, we are reminded of the declaration during the committal service, "earth to earth and ashes to ashes and dust to dust". It provides a reminder to us of the cycle of life, from creation in

the depths of our mother's womb to death and from physical creation to a new spiritual life. Tonight, we are reminded of those words and our life journey. The distribution of ashes serves as a reminder of cleansing and renewal through repentance and the gift of forgiveness. Ashes were once used as a cleansing agent in the absence of soap. Tonight, on this Ash Wednesday, the ashes have also been understood as a reminder of our baptismal cleansing. Each day is a remembrance of our baptism. Like the proclamation of the Word and the waters of baptism, in the receiving of the ashes, we are reminded that we have been cleansed of our sin by the presence of our Jesus through his life, his death and resurrection. Just as the baptismal waters wash and refreshes, drowns and makes alive, so the ashes tell the story of our journey with our Lord on this Ash Wednesday.

Words of Institution

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.
